## **General Information and FAQ's**

### **What time is Check In?**

Please check in with the coordinator between 8:00-8.30 AM on Saturday morning.

### **Do I need to bring Coggins/Health Certificate?**

Yes, ensure that you have a current coggins for your horse and a health certificate if travelling from out of state.

### **About this clinic:**

You don't want to miss a thing so be ready before 9:00am. You will just need to bring yourself without your horse for the first part of the morning. Then we will head out with horses and instructions. We will focus on a variety of tasks with lots of simulations and interactions. Questions, comments and clarifications are appreciated and encouraged.

### **Start time/Estimated Finish Time/Breaks:**

Start time will be at 9:00AM each day

Finish time will be approximately 4.00 p.m. each day.

There will be a short morning and afternoon break with a one hour lunch break.

Please bring your own lunch

### **Will I be riding?**

That will depend on the layout and level of the clinic or workshop and where you are with your horse at the time. If you are not planning on riding then you won't need to bring riding equipment.

### **What do I need to bring?**

**Please bring a lunch (Water and Snacks will be provided)**

#### **Clothing:**

Please wear comfortable clothing/proper riding apparel i.e. boots and helmet.

Depending on the weather, we may be in an indoor arena or outside in an open field. Hat, sunglasses, sunscreen, bug spray, rain gear and a beverage container are suggested.

### Equipment:

#### Bring all your Parelli equipment:

- Carrot Stick and String
- Halter and 12' lead
- 22' Line
- 45' Line
- Bareback pad only if you have one
- Saddle and Pad (equipped with cinches and shims if you have them)
- Natural Hackamore
- Bridle
- Brushes
- Fly spray is sometimes a good thing to remember

### Can I bring my family members or friends?

We love auditors! Guests and auditors will participate in some of the simulations and exercises during the clinic/workshop. *(Please ask coordinator for prices.)*

### Will there be a stall for my horse?

- All horses must be stabled if staying on the facility overnight.
- Participants are responsible for cleaning their stall throughout the course of the day if the stall is used during lunchtime or any other time.
- Horses are not to be tied to a trailer over night.
- Shavings are provided, but student must clean stall and leave it the way it was found before being used.
- Please no portable pens or tying horses to trailer overnight allowed.

### What do I need for my horse?

Please bring your own hay, grain, feed pans and water buckets. It is also a good idea to have extra snaps and a stall card with your name and a phone number where you can be reached in case of emergencies during after hours.

### Other Information:

#### Filming/Notes:

Auditors, feel free to bring your pens, paper and a seat cushion. There will be no filming allowed, but take as many pictures as you like.

#### Stallions/Dogs:

Stallions and dogs are not permitted in the clinic or on the grounds.

#### Will I be assessed on my levels?

This won't be done during a clinic or workshop setting, ask your coordinator for the possibility of private lesson time, or what other services may be available.
